Why am I being warned about exposure to marijuana smoke?

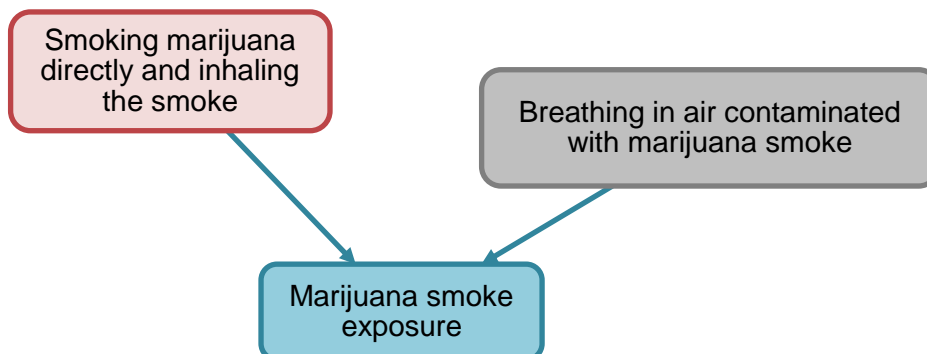


- Marijuana smoke is on the [Proposition 65](#) list because it can cause cancer.
- Exposure to marijuana smoke may increase the risk of cancer.
- Proposition 65 requires businesses to determine if they must provide a warning about exposure to [listed chemicals](#).

What is marijuana smoke?

- Marijuana smoke is formed when the dried leaves, flowers, stems, seeds, and resins of marijuana plants are burned.
- Marijuana smoke contains several thousand different compounds. Many of these compounds cause cancer, and at least 33 of them are also on the Proposition 65 list. These include the carcinogens [arsenic](#), [benzene](#), [cadmium](#), hexavalent chromium, [formaldehyde](#), [lead](#), [mercury](#), and nickel.
- Marijuana smoke contains many of the same chemicals and carcinogens as tobacco smoke. Marijuana may be mixed with tobacco and smoked.

How does exposure to marijuana smoke occur?



- Pregnant women who smoke marijuana or spend time in places where marijuana is smoked can expose their baby to marijuana smoke.

How can I reduce my family's exposure to marijuana smoke?

- ⊗ As with tobacco, avoid smoking marijuana around children and do not allow children to spend time in places where marijuana is being smoked.
